Keynote: Telemedicine from the Home - PDA Home Monitoring

Stanley M. Finkelstein, Ph.D.

Dr. Finkelstein is a Professor of Laboratory Medicine and Pathology in the Medical School at the University of Minnesota. Dr. Finkelstein served as Interim Director of the Division of Health Informatics for 2000-2001. He is also a member of the Graduate Faculties of Biomedical Engineering, Biophysical Sciences and Medical Physics, Biomedical Sciences, and Health Informatics. He served as Director of Graduate Studies for both Biomedical Engineering and Health Informatics graduate programs for many years. His interests are in the areas of patient home monitoring in chronic diseases, telemedicine, medical informatics, vascular compliance and simulation of physiological systems.

Beth Dosland Mullan, R.N., B.S.N.

Beth has been a practicing nurse since 1982. She has a variety of critical care experience both at the Mayo Clinic and the University of Minnesota Hospital. Beth began working with the lung transplant program at the University of Minnesota in 1990 and held the position of Lung Transplant Coordinator. Beth began working with the lung transplant program in its infancy and saw the program develop into one of the premier lung transplant programs in the country. In 1998, she began working with Dr. Finkelstein and the home monitoring program as the Home Monitoring Nurse Coordinator.
